Mammoth Museum receives grant to preserve local history
We are reaching out to our community

The Mammoth Museum at the Hayden Cabin has been awarded a grant from the California State Library that will be used to gather historical items from the community (slides, negatives, VHS cassettes, film, maps and posters) to convert to a digital file. Once digitized, these historical and cultural items will be able to be viewed and shared on any computer or device.

This might be a good time for you to look at your old memorabilia, and ask other (and older) family members to uncover what you and they may have that really needs to be preserved. This is a rare opportunity to discover these non-digital items and have them converted. We specifically are looking for items pertaining to the Eastern Sierra, and in the form of slides, negatives, cassettes, film, and VHS cassettes. Old family vacation film, photos and slides, are a great source of historically significant objects.
